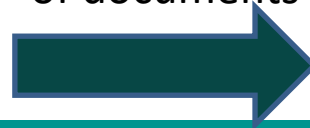

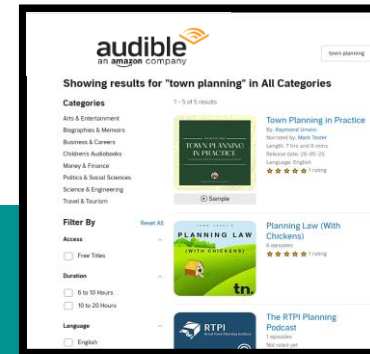

The Integrated Data Service (IDS) is a UK government initiative. It is designed to transform the way data about society and the economy are made available, for vital research and decision making in the UK.

The Office for National Statistics is leading the delivery and the service is open to analysts within government, the Devolved Administrations and accredited researchers external to government.

How will the IDS change data sharing across government?

Data standards

One of the focuses of the IDS is data standardisation

The IDS will be championing the adoption of common data standards across government departments and organisations

We are working closely and effectively with the CDDO within Cabinet Office to progress this

Data sharing

Data sharing agreements will be broader and standardised

This would replace current agreements that are designed for a specific purpose/policy issue

Reduction in time, costs and bureaucracy whilst maintaining standards

The power of Integrated Data

- The richness of data comes from when it's standardised, linked and brought together
- Inform policy interventions through rapid analysis of data and evidence
- Increased culture of analytical collaboration that builds trust in statistics
- Support the decommissioning of legacy systems
